VALUE EDUCATION

1. Jain Value Education

- ✓ The Jain Value Education classes were conducted at Subodh Public School from April 2025 and commenced with great enthusiasm. Regular sessions were held every Saturday for **174 students**, with separate sections organized for **Digamber and Shwetamber** students.
- ✓ A total of **25 classes** were conducted with the aim of learning and understanding the following Jain values:
 - ✓ **Ahimsa (Non-Violence):** Encouraging kindness towards all living beings.
 - ✓ **Anekantavada (Non-Absolutism):** Promoting tolerance and understanding of different perspectives.
 - ✓ **Aparigraha (Non-Possessiveness):** Focusing on simplicity and minimalism.
- ✓ Teaching Methods
 - ✓ **Storytelling:** Teachers shared stories highlighting Jain values.
 - ✓ **Discussions:** Open discussions were conducted on how these values can be applied in daily life.
- ✓ To encourage students and provide life learnings, the school also organized value education classes. Students were guided through the book *Subodhi Ki Orr*, especially designed for children, which builds strong character, develops moral thinking, and promotes respect and empathy towards society.
- ✓ Students were further guided by Shraddhay Shri Yashwant Muni Ji Maharaj Sahab, Subhash Muni Ji Maharaj Sahab, and Ashok Muni Ji Maharaj Sahab, who emphasized the importance of a simple lifestyle, moral values, and self-discipline.
- ✓ A comprehensive assessment was conducted at the end of the session on 13 February 2026, where students participated actively and demonstrated keen interest in the subject.
- ✓ The programme helped students understand the importance of moral values and ethical living. Their engagement during classes reflected growing awareness and curiosity towards Jain principles.
- ✓ **Conclusion:** The Jain Value Education programme proved to be meaningful and effective. It provided students with valuable life lessons while encouraging discipline, compassion, and respect for others. Subodh Public School continues to support such initiatives for the holistic development of students.

2. “Subodhi Ki Orr” (Moral & Value Education)

- ✓ Moral and Value Education plays a vital role in the holistic development of students. Keeping this in view, “*Subodhi Ki Orr*” has been included in the school curriculum as an essential subject.
- ✓ The school expresses its sincere gratitude to Subodh Shiksha Samiti for introducing this value-based book. The book has enabled students to understand and adopt moral values in a simple and effective manner. Through structured lessons and meaningful content, students are learning important life skills such as positive thinking, discipline, and respect for others.
- ✓ Students completed the Activity Book along with the main textbook. Teachers conducted various interactive and value-based activities throughout the academic year, ensuring active student engagement. Students participated enthusiastically in all activities. Initiatives like the *Piggy Bank Activity* helped inculcate values of charity, kindness, and social responsibility. Through inspiring stories of great personalities like Lord Mahavir, students learned important moral lessons and life values.
- ✓ Students also learned devotional songs (bhajans), which strengthened their cultural and ethical understanding. The subject helped students relearn the names of Hindi months and become familiar with important cultural concepts. A noticeable improvement was observed in students’ behaviour, manners, interpersonal skills, and health awareness. Parents shared positive feedback, mentioning improved behaviour, greater respect toward elders, and constructive changes in daily habits.
- ✓ For academic evaluation, examinations were conducted twice during the session—once in the First Term and once in the Final Term.
- ✓ Overall, *Subodhi Ki Orr* has proved to be a meaningful initiative, contributing significantly to students’ moral development and character building.



ACADEMICS

1. Remedial Classes

- ✓ Subodh Public School organised remedial classes for students from Class VI onwards with the aim of strengthening academic performance and providing structured learning support. These classes were conducted in the morning, one hour prior to the regular school timetable, and commenced immediately after the declaration of the First Unit Test results.
- ✓ **Purpose and Aim:** The primary purpose of conducting remedial classes was to offer additional guidance to students who required academic support. The initiative focused on one-to-one teaching, clearing subject-specific doubts, revising core concepts, completing students' backlogs, and helping newly admitted students adjust to the school curriculum. Special attention was given to slow learners as well as students preparing for board examinations. Remedial sessions were organised for every subject across all classes to ensure inclusive academic development.
- ✓ **Outcomes and Benefits:** The remedial programme yielded highly positive results. Students showed noticeable improvement in conceptual understanding, confidence, and classroom participation. Many learners demonstrated better performance in subsequent assessments and examinations. Personalized attention helped students overcome learning gaps, strengthen fundamentals, and develop effective study habits.
- ✓ New admission students benefited greatly from structured guidance, enabling them to integrate smoothly into regular classroom learning. Board class students received focused mentoring, revision support, and motivation, which enhanced their exam readiness.
- ✓ Encouraged by the success of this initiative, the school continues to conduct remedial classes, especially for board classes, both offline and online, providing last-minute academic support, guidance, and motivation whenever required.
- ✓ **Conclusion:** The remedial classes have proven to be a valuable academic intervention, fostering improved results, increased student confidence, and holistic learning. Subodh Public School remains committed to nurturing every learner's potential through continuous support and dedicated teaching efforts.

2. Competitive Classes

- ✓ School organised Competitive Classes for **Class XI and XII** students with the objective of preparing them for major entrance examinations such as **NEET, JEE, CA, CS and CLAT**. The initiative aimed to provide focused academic guidance, strengthen core concepts, and help students develop exam-oriented strategies alongside their regular curriculum.
- ✓ **Aim / Targets:** The primary aims of conducting these competitive classes were:
 - ✓ To prepare students systematically for national-level competitive examinations.
 - ✓ To strengthen subject fundamentals and problem-solving skills.
 - ✓ To guide students in time management, exam patterns, and question analysis.
 - ✓ To motivate learners and build confidence through regular practice and mentoring.
 - ✓ Special emphasis was placed on concept clarity, doubt-solving sessions, and continuous assessment to track progress.
 - ✓ These accomplishments highlight the positive impact of targeted coaching, regular practice, and personalized mentoring provided through the competitive classes.

- ✓ **Conclusion:** The Competitive Classes have proved to be a valuable academic initiative, helping students move confidently toward their career goals. Subodh Public School remains committed to nurturing students' potential by offering continuous guidance, motivation, and structured preparation for competitive examinations, ensuring both academic growth and future readiness.

**4. Comparative Result Analysis**

- Comparative Result Analysis was conducted for three main examinations during the academic session 2025-26 with the objective of closely monitoring students' academic progress and enhancing overall teaching-learning outcomes.

✓ Objectives:

- Evaluate Academic Performance - To understand how students are performing across subjects and classes.
- Ensure Accountability - To promote responsibility among teachers and extend academic support to students who need additional guidance.
- Identify Performance Gaps - To recognize areas requiring improvement at both student and subject levels.

- ✓ **Outcomes:** The Comparative Result Analysis proved to be highly beneficial in strengthening academic planning and support strategies. It helped in:

- Identifying low-performing students and subjects for focused intervention.
- Sharing best teaching practices and improving teaching effectiveness through collaboration among teachers.

- Providing extra classes, mentoring, and additional learning materials to support weaker students.
- ✓ Ensuring consistency in learning, which supported better conceptual understanding among students who attended these additional sessions. The analysis enabled timely corrective measures and encouraged a more structured academic approach, leading to improved student engagement and performance.
- ✓ **Conclusion:** Comparative Result Analysis served as an effective academic tool, helping the school take informed decisions for continuous improvement. The collected data played a crucial role in planning remedial measures and strengthening instructional strategies.
- ✓ Data for the Comparative Result Analysis has been collected and maintained for record and reference.

5. The Humming Bird International English Olympiad

- Subodh Public School proudly participated in the Humming Bird International Olympiads 2025-26 (English) with active participation from 53 students of Classes II to XII.
- The Olympiad was conducted with the objective of enhancing students' LSRW skills (Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing) and strengthening their overall command of English, including vocabulary, spelling, grammar, and comprehension. The initiative successfully promoted linguistic confidence, analytical thinking, and academic excellence.

The SAFAL KSA Main Assessment was held from November 10 to December 2, 2025 for students who were in Classes V and VIII during the 2024–25 session and are currently in Classes VI and IX in the 2025–26 session, in the subjects of English, Mathematics, and Science.

The session aimed to inform and guide them about CBSE guidelines, examination protocols, and important instructions to be followed during the board examinations. Admit cards were distributed to the students immediately after the session.

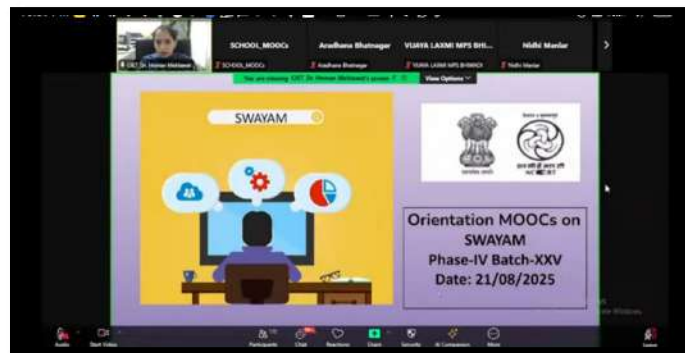


SCHOOL INNOVATION COUNCIL

- National Council of Science Museums (under Ministry of Culture), Government of Rajasthan & Department of Science and Technology, Rajasthan organized Seminar on Innovation in STEM Teaching. Various innovative projects were demonstrated by Y. K. Vijay, Director, Centre for Innovation in Science and Technology (CIST). Other prominent speakers included:
 - K. S. Sharma, Chief Guest and President, Indian Association of Physics Teachers (IAPT)
 - Rajeev Agrawal, Associate Professor, Malaviya National Institute of Technology, Jaipur



- The orientation programme ()introduced teachers handling Classes IX to XII to the structure, benefits, and enrolment process of NCERT's online courses hosted on the SWAYAM portal. A live **demonstration was conducted to guide teachers on account creation, course selection, and participation** in online modules, assessments, and certification. The session emphasized blended learning, digital pedagogy, and effective classroom integration of online resources.



- The school sensitised students of Classes VI to X about the INSPIRE Awards – MANAK scheme through orientation sessions and idea-generation workshops. Students were guided to identify day-to-day problems from their surroundings and propose innovative solutions in the form of original ideas. The Nodal Teacher facilitated registration and submission of shortlisted ideas on the official INSPIRE-MANAK portal on September 30, 2025 as per the prescribed guidelines



- The project “Smart Segre Bins” is an automated waste segregation system generated by a team of students and represented at Saint Soldier School, Pratap Nagar, Sanganer by Nishad Sharma and Saransh Jain of Class XI. It was integrated with the uses of sensors, Internet of Things (IoT) technology, and a microcontroller-based control unit to identify and segregate biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste. The model also monitors waste levels, temperature, humidity, and gas emissions to support timely collection and safe handling of waste. The project aligns with national cleanliness and sustainability initiatives such as Swachh Bharat Mission

The model was tested with different types of waste materials. The following observations were recorded:

- The model successfully segregated wet, dry, and metallic waste in test demonstrations.
- Automated monitoring helped in accurately identifying the fill level of the dustbin.
- The system reduced the need for manual handling of waste.
- The working model demonstrated the feasibility of using IoT for waste management in schools and public places.

The Smart Segre Bins project demonstrates how simple technological interventions can address major environmental challenges. The working model showcases innovation in waste segregation and monitoring, promoting cleanliness, sustainability, and scientific thinking. The project successfully aligns with CBSE’s vision of experiential learning and national cleanliness initiatives

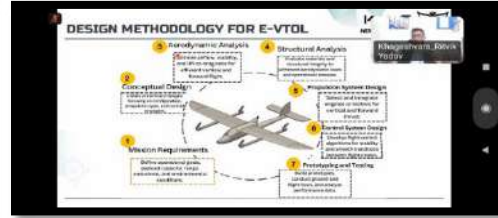
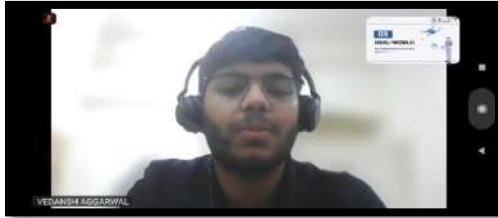


- In alignment with the Viksit Bharat Abhiyan 2047, The Bharat Space Education Research Centre conducted Online Aircraft Design Workshop and an Advance Drone (Air Taxi Workshop) to enhance and promote space education.

The workshop supported the goals of Viksit Bharat Abhiyan by nurturing scientific temper, innovation culture, and future-ready skills among students. It also complemented ATL objectives of tinkering, creativity, and problem-based learning. Students learned about the structure of an aircraft, the function of each component, principles of lift and drag, and the importance of balance

and stability in flight. The instructors also explained the use of modern technologies like drone design, propulsion systems, and performance estimation.

This experience helped them understand how science, technology, and innovation come together in real-world aerospace engineering. It also encouraged me to think about the role of economics and information technology in aviation development and future transport systems.



- The School Innovation Marathon – Viksit Bharat Buildathon was organised to promote innovation, problem-solving, and design thinking among students. The event provided a platform for students to ideate, prototype, and present solutions aligned with the vision of a developed India (Viksit Bharat).

The Innovation Marathon successfully fostered a culture of creativity and experiential learning in the school. It empowered students to think critically, innovate responsibly, and contribute ideas towards the vision of Viksit Bharat. The event aligned well with CBSE’s competency-based learning approach and the objectives of Atal Tinkering Labs.

- On the occasion of the 84th Foundation Day of The Council of Scientific & Industrial Research CSIR-CEERI (Central Electronics Engineering Research Institute) run and governed by the MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, GOVT. OF INDIA, a group of 15 students from Subodh Public, Sanganer with Teacher Mentor Ms. Teesha Upadhyay visited the institute at Malviya Nagar Industrial Area, Jaipur.

The visit aimed at providing the students with practical exposure to the pioneering research and innovations in the field of electronics and allied sciences.

During the program, the students attended the inaugural session where eminent scientists and dignitaries highlighted the remarkable journey of CSIR-CEERI since its establishment and its immense contribution to national development through advanced research in electronics and technology. *Build trust between the police and the community, fostering a sense of security.

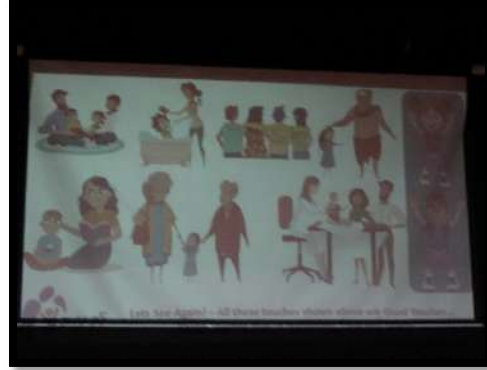
The sessions emphasize the following crucial contact number:
